3. Regulatory Reset Proposal 2020-25

Jess Vonthethoff provided an update on progress on the 2020-25 Draft Plan which is out for consultation, with submissions due on 19/9/18.

The Customer Consultative Panel (CCP) has a focus on the three points outlined by Rob Stobbe in the foreword:

- Keeping a lid on prices
- Maintaining reliability and supply
- Transitioning to the network of the future

The CCP will be putting in a detailed submission on the Draft Plan.

In terms of vegetation management:

- OPEX workshop showed working with Councils and other stakeholders to deliver efficient and effective outcomes
- 14% (\$213m) Opex budget for 2020-25
- SAPN benchmark well
- ARG support for approach outlined in plan

Action:

ARG to draft a letter in support of our approach for vegetation management in 2020-25.

4. Presentation on growth forecasts

KC provided an overview on the growth forecasts being undertaken for vegetation to improve forward planning.

5. Protocol review 2018

The protocol is being reviewed in 2018. A track change version of the revised document was emailed for review. AL outlined the key changes proposed.

The revised protocol will be sent to all councils for feedback via a LGA Circular and will be presented to the LGA Board for endorsement in early 2019.

Action:

ARG feedback on protocol to be forwarded to AL by 5/10/18.

6. Powerline friendly list of species

The draft species list was sent to all workshop attendees for review and feedback. The revised booklet and list, developed in accordance with our corporate style guide and following stakeholder feedback, was presented at the meeting.

Nursery industry feedback on the list in terms of availability and suitability is crucial. Nurseries often require a 2-year lead in time, as well as assurance Councils will plant.

The species list is a good step forward and should be reviewed in 3 years. From a SAPN perspective its goal is to encourage trees suitable for planting under powerlines.

Roll-out of the strategy with Councils needs further consideration but as a minimum SAPN need to liaise with Councils (LGA Circular and letter to CEO's post November elections) and work with HMA and other bodies to promote.

Action:

ARG feedback to be forwarded to AL by 5/10/18. AL to liaise with nursery industry to seek feedback on list.

7. Update on strategic initiatives

7.1 Regulatory amendments

The current Regulations expire on 1.9.2021 and SA Power Networks is looking at a number of amendments. Twenty-four submissions were received on the discussion paper and proposed amendments – 19 Council, 4 Government agencies and 1 community group.

Briefings on the proposed amendments have been offered with key Ministers – Mark Parnell, Hon. Susan Close and Hon. van Holst Pellekaan.

7.2 Visual amenity assessment

The first site has been cut to amenity pruning on Main Rd, Blackwood in discussions with ATS and Council staff. Whilst there was general agreement that the tree looked better from a visual perspective, further analysis on tree health, compliance and cost needs to be assessed.

There is an opportunity to communicate the assessment proactively and highlight the partnering with Councils to assess different pruning.

The next proposed site is a row of Ash trees on Woodside Rd, Lobethal. The trial should undertake cutting when the trees are dormant and in-leaf (Winter and late Spring).

7.3 Sapling trial

SA Power Networks in partnership with the Adelaide Hills Council has undertaken a trial in the Gumeracha area to remove saplings in 69 spans on both public roadsides and on public/ private land. Feedback from Council and landowners has been very positive.

7.4 Visibility tool

A proof of concept has been developed but further development is on hold as part of the Customer Portal/ website phase 2.

7.5 Training program for contractors

In 2018, contractor training will focus on hazard tree and sapling identification and native vegetation. The training module is currently in draft and feedback is being sought from key stakeholders.
